He has served in academic settings, teaching coursework in adult development and ageing, rising to the position of Research Professor of Psychology. Dr. Camp holds workshops on designing cognitive and behavioural interventions for dementia internationally. His current research involves the use of Montessoribased activities as rehabilitative interventions to enable long-term care residents with dementia to effectively lead activities for other residents with dementia.
